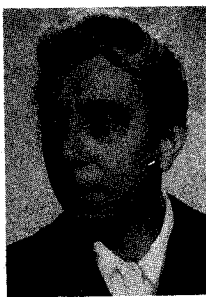


Appointments and Promotions

To Full Professor

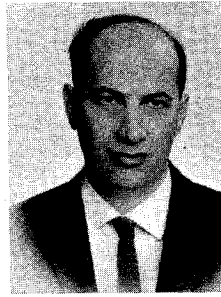

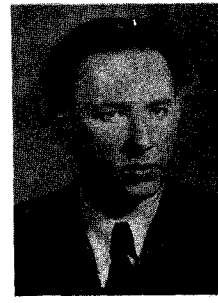

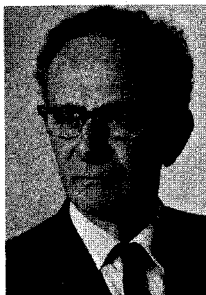

Deans

The Order was awarded by the Dutch Ambassador, Baron O.F. Bentinck van Schoonheten, at the home of the Dutch Consul in Haifa.

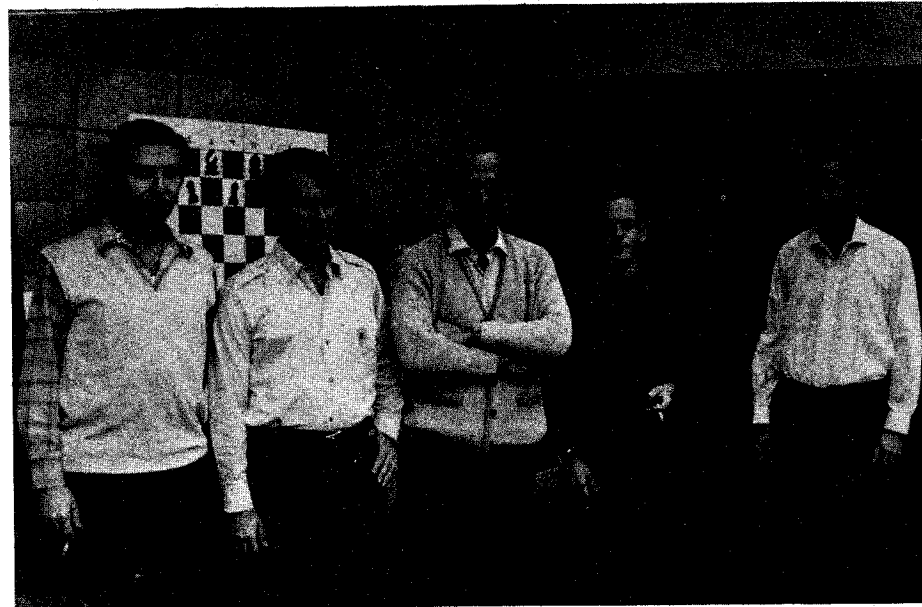
